- 13- Blanket Flower (Gaillardia x spp.), 3 stems
- 14 - Calendula, 6 blooms

- 21 - Coral Bells, (Heuchera x spp.), 3 stems
- 22 - Cosmos, 3 stems
- 23 - Dahlia, giant, 1 bloom over 6 inches
- 24 - Dahlia, medium, 1 bloom between 2in and 6 in across
- 25 - Dahlia, small, 1 bloom 2 inches or less
- 26 - Daisies, (Leucanthemum x spp.), single, 3 stems
- 27 - Daisies, (Leucanthemum x spp.), double 3 stems
- 28 - Day Lily (Hemerocallis x spp.), 1 scape/stem
- 29 - Delphinium, perennial (Delphinium x spp.),1 spike

- 30 - Gladiola, 1 spike, 20-inch stem from lowest florets, 1/3 open, 1/3 color, 1/3 green.
- 31 - Hollyhock, (Alcea x spp.), 1 stem
- 32 - Hydrangea 1 stem
- 33 - Larkspur, annual (Consolida x spp.), 1 spike
- 34 - Lily, Asiatic, out-facing, 1 stem
