

Department I – Field & Farm Crops

Harvested Grains

No Samples of treated threshed grain will be accepted for exhibit or for competition for premium awards.

Exhibits in this division must be from the grain crop of the previous year. Each sample will be the required amount for each sample. This is the equivalent of 2 quarts. All exhibits in this division become the property of the Marshall County Fair.

Variety names will be required on each exhibit.

SELECTION POINTERS

Small Grains

Uniformity – As early as possible, every kernel in the sample should correspond to every other kernel in size, shape and color.

Purity - A show sample should be absolutely free from: seeds of other grains, weed seeds, dirt, straw, sticks, chaff, etc.

Plumpness of Kernel – Indicated: weight per bushel, yield and strength of breeding.

Clover

Plumpness of Kernel – Indicated weight per in size and shape meet with favor with the judges.

Mixture – No other seeds should be in the sample and all kinds of foreign matter (weeds, seeds, dirt, etc.) are objectionable.

Color – Bright, cheerful luster is preferred to dull, dead color.

Potatoes

Do not wash exhibits. Brushing with a soft brush will remove the soil and leave the skin in its natural condition.

Select the exhibit at digging time if possible. Wrap each potato in paper as soon as selected and store in a dry, dark, cool place.

Select the tubers of the average size for the variety that are in uniform size

Select tubers of good type for the variety. Round blunt or black ends are characteristic of most varieties. Avoid pointed tubers of irregular shapes.

Select only clean, bright specimens or those free from scab, black scurf, stems and rots, mechanical injury or sunburn.

Select full weight as called for in the premium list and correctly label the sample.

Samples will be judged for forage purposes to leaves should be left on samples. Sheaves should be full length of harvested crop, at least 2 inches in diameter at lower band, and in case of corn, should contain not less than 6 stalks with ears intact.
